Nashoba Carriage Classic Special Awards

Concours d'Elegance. Awarded separately to Carriage and to Sidesaddle: The essence of the competition is the word "Elegance." The winner will be the turnout which presents the most elegant effect. This will include vehicle, harness, appointments, horses, driver, passengers, grooms, etc., but above all, general impression is most important. Vehicle and harness may be inspected to ensure thoughtful restoration and careful maintenance. Attention will be paid to the personal appearance of the driver, groom(s), and passenger(s) as it contributes to the overall picture. Period costumes are definitely prohibited. Performance will not be judged unless it detracts from the elegance of the turnout.

High Point Welsh Trophy: Trophy is awarded by Rollingwoods Farm to the WPCSA registered Welsh entry that accumulates the highest number of points in the Nashoba Carriage Classic Pleasure Show. This does not include Concours d'Elegance, Nashoba Favorites, or Magnolia Drive.

High Point Sidesaddle Trophy: Trophy is awarded by Mid-South Sidesaddle Association to the sidesaddle entry that accumulates the highest number of points while riding aside at the Nashoba Carriage Classic Pleasure Show. Classes to be considered for the High Point: Open Equitation and Open Pleasure Walk-Trot, Open Equitation and Open Pleasure Walk-Trot-Canter, Command Class Walk-Trot, Hunter Hack 18", and Magnolia Drive (Sidesaddle).

High Point Adult Trophy: Trophy is awarded to the adult driver who accumulates the highest number of points in the Nashoba Carriage Classic Pleasure Show. This does not include Concours d'Elegance, Nashoba Favorites, or Magnolia Drive.

Carriage Dog: First place specialty ribbon sponsored by the Memphis Kennel Club.

Ribbons and Trophies

Pleasure Show 1st – 6th Place Ribbons per class; Coach Dog 1st-4th for Traditional Breeds

and 1st-4th, Non-Traditional Breeds. Championship and Reserve per Division.

Concours d'Elegance Special Award

Magnolia Drive 1st – 6th Place Ribbons (Judged) 1st Place Ribbon (Poker Run)

Awarding Points for High Point Trophies

Points at the Nashoba Carriage Classic are awarded in accordance with a weighted scoring system. The weighted system is used to fairly distribute points to competitors with the most competition in a given class. A competitor winning a class with fewer entries will not be awarded the same number of points as someone competing in a class with six or more entries.

Entries: Entries open August 1 and must be postmarked by October 1, 2023. Post entries will be accepted for a one-time post entry fee of \$30 plus the designated entry fee for each class. The Driving Derby entry fee is \$50. Pleasure Show entry fee is \$20 per class.

ADS Rules: The 2023 NCC Pleasure Show is an ADS recognized show. Unless otherwise noted in the class descriptions, every class herein is covered by the current rules and specifications of the American Driving Society and will be judged in accordance therewith.

General Information, Cont'd.

Junior Drivers: The "competition age" of an individual will be the age reached during the calendar year. Junior - Competition age under 19 years old. At all times while on a carriage or riding an equine, all Juniors must wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds current ASTM/SEI standards (Art 5.11)

Food: Appetizers and soft drinks provided for all on Friday night. Saturday lunch will be available for purchase. Saturday evening banquet tickets available in office. Sunday lunch is provided for all.

Camping: Reservation required. Hookup available for \$75 fee. Contact show secretary.

Dogs: Must be on a leash and controlled at all times. No exceptions!!

Driving Class Specifications

NEW: Utility Division: Article 215.3 Open to marathon vehicles which are specifically built for Combined Driving marathon use.

Class Size: A minimum of three entries constitutes a class. In the event there are two or fewer entries per class, management reserves the right to combine or cancel any class. Management reserves the right to add or divide any class, or make any changes required by circumstances.

Horse & Pony Size: Equines over 14.2 hands (58" / 148cm) in height will be classified as horses; those 14.2 hands and under will be classified as ponies. Exception: A registered horse of a breed permitting horses to be 14.2 or under (e.g., Arabian, Morgan, Quarter Horse) may show in either division but only one size division at the same show (i.e., as a pony or a horse). If an equine is under 14.2 hands but also eligible to compete in the Horse Division (e.g., Gypsy Vanner, Hafflinger, and Fell Pony), it does not qualify to compete in the Draft Horse Division.

Multiple Entries: Horses and ponies used in Multiples division turnouts may also be driven as a single. The same turnout may be driven in more than one division without altering the course.

Junior Drivers: ADS, Art 2.7: The "competition age" of an individual will be the age reached during the current calendar year. "Junior" is competition age under 19. Junior drivers must wear an ASTM/SEI approved helmet at all times while on a carriage or riding an equine. Helmet must be securely fastened. Junior drivers under 14 must be accompanied by an adult who is a knowledgeable driver. The same turnout may be driven by both a junior driver and an adult.

Wire Wheel and Pneumatic Tired-Vehicles are permitted.

Release Waivers must be signed for all drivers, passengers, grooms, and volunteers.

Driving Class Specifications, Cont'd.

Grooms/Passengers: A groom is optional for all single turnouts at all times except for turnouts with an equine 120 cm or taller competing in the Driving Derby. Four-in-hands and unicorns are required to have two grooms or passengers on the vehicle to assist in the event of difficulty. Pairs or tandems are required to carry one groom.

Dress/Harness: Drivers and passengers will be dressed conservatively according to the style of their vehicle for pleasure driving classes. No period costumes unless specifically called for. Driving aprons or lap robes, hats, gloves, and driving whip are required while driving in all classes (unless waived by the judge). Martingales and overchecks are prohibited in obstacle classes for all vehicles. **Helmets are strongly encouraged for all classes but mandatory for juniors and for anyone participating in the Driving Derby!**

Vehicles: Entrants may use more than one vehicle for non-championship classes. However, for division championships, an entry is defined as the driver, the equine(s), and the vehicle; any change in the above within a division requires the turnout to carry a different number. Points are accumulated separately for each entry number.

Driving Derby

Derby Divisions: Pair/Multiples Draft Horse

Single Horse Junior Driver

Single Pony VSE (Very Small Equine)

Not ADS Recognized.

One or more rounds over a course consisting of pairs of cones and marathon-type obstacles. Width measurement of obstacles will be at least 2 meters. A round is run as a timed competition with penalties converted to seconds. Total time determines placings and the lowest time wins. The times plus penalty scores for multiple rounds are added to produce final scores and placings. Ties will be broken by the fewest penalty points, a drive-off, or may remain at management discretion. An equine may compete no more than three rounds in a single day.

Course: All competitors will do Gates A, B, C, D.

Eligibility: Competition is open to equines and athletes in all divisions. Classes may consist of VSE, Small Pony, Large Pony, & Horse turned out as singles, pairs, tandems, unicorns, and four-in-hands. Classes may be combined at Organizer's discretion.

Carriage: Marathon-type carriage with iron or solid-rubber tires is encouraged. There are no required weights or track widths. Harness: Bridle must have a full noseband. No type of check or auxiliary reins is allowed. Breeching is required for all single turnouts and for any vehicle without brakes.

Safety: All Athletes and navigator(s) must wear securely fastened protective headgear which meets ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use. Safety (protective) vests are required for all drivers and navigators.

Groom(s):

a. Singles, pairs and tandems: One groom required at all times except single VSE and single Small Pony.

b. Unicorns and four-in-hands: Two grooms at all times except VSE, which only requires one groom.

Release Waivers must be signed for all drivers, passengers, grooms, and volunteers.

DRIVING CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES

Turnout: A Pleasure Driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the performance and quality of each turnout. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. To stand quietly and to rein back. To be judged:

•70% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, spares and appropriateness, neatness and appropriateness of attire and overall impression.

• 30% on performance, manners and way of going.

Timed Obstacles: To be driven over a prescribed course of 14-18 obstacles. After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle in order to the finish line. Faults are scored as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Places are determined by low time basis. Ties for first will be decided by a drive off. Standard width measurement of obstacles will be in meters: Pairs & Multiples 2.0, Horse 2.0, Pony 1.8, VSE 1.5.

Working: A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the suitability of the horse to provide a pleasant drive. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot (Draft Horse Division—walk, slow trot, and working trot). Entries will be required to stand quietly and rein back. All entries chosen for a workout may be worked both ways of the ring at any gait requested by the judge, and may be asked to execute a figure eight. To be judged: 70% on performance, manners, and way of going; 20% on condition and fit of harness and vehicle; and 10% on neatness of attire.

Reinsmanship: A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the ability and skill of the driver. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. Drivers shall be required to rein back. All drivers chosen for a workout may be worked at any gait requested by the judge and may be asked to execute appropriate tests. The driver should be seated comfortably on the box so as to be relaxed and effective. Either the one or two-handed method of driving is acceptable. Common to both methods, the elbows and arms should be close to the body with an allowing but steady hand enabling a consistent "feel" with the horse's mouth. Drivers should not be penalized or rewarded for using one general style over another. To be judged: 75% on handling of reins and whip, control, posture, and overall impression of driver; 25% on the condition of harness and vehicle and neatness of attire.

Fault and Out: A timed course of numbered obstacles to be driven at the trot. The number of obstacles to be proportionate to the dimensions of the driving area and not to exceed 10 obstacles. After passing through the start markers, the driver proceeds through each consecutively numbered obstacle, in order, until the allowed time expires (suggested time, 90 seconds to two minutes), or until an obstacle is dislodged or a disobedience occurs. If all the obstacles are driven cleanly before the allowed time expires, the driver will begin the course again, starting with obstacle #1, without having to pass through the Start markers. (However, passing through the Start markers more than once is not considered "off course" and is not penalized.) Two points will be scored for each obstacle cleared before the time allowed expires or an obstacle is dislodged. When the allowed time expires, a disobedience occurs, or an obstacle is dislodged, a signal will be given. The driver then proceeds through the next consecutively numbered obstacle. The time will be taken when the rear axle clears this obstacle. If that obstacle is cleared, one Pleasure Driving point is scored. If it is dislodged, no points for that dislodged obstacle are scored, but the time is still taken. The score of a driver who fails to drive the next consecutively numbered obstacle after the whistle is blown counts, up to the point where the signal is given, but the competitor must be placed after those with an equal score and time. Placings will be determined by the greatest number of points. Standard width measurement of obstacles will be in meters: Pairs & Multiples 2.0, Horse 2.0, Pony 1.8, VSE 1.5.

NASHOBA FAVORITES (Nashoba Favorites do not count toward high point trophies.)

Carriage Dog: A fun class for you and your other four-legged friend. The dog must ride in the vehicle, either standing, sitting or lying down. He should be quiet, well behaved and appear to enjoy the ride. The dog may wear a leash, but the dog must not be tied to the driver, passengers or to the vehicle. The dog may be held by a passenger in their lap or by a leash.

Drive and Ride: The Drive and Ride Class is conducted according to ADS Article 227. All riders and all juniors must wear ASTM/SEI approved helmets while astride. Choose Walk-Trot OR Walk-Trot-Canter class.

Magnolia Drive: To be driven over 3-5k of lovely wooded trails through Germantown woods and neighboring estates. Course simulates a Sunday country drive, and includes small hills and easy terrain. Drive is not timed. Excessive speed is penalized. Entries must pass the spares and safety check before going on course. Grooms/passengers encouraged, but not required with single VSE, pony or horse. Judged on Working Class Standards (general manners, way of going, suitability of equine for the task, and overall impression). During the Magnolia Drive, Poker Cards will be given. One award for the highest ranking hand (per Poker Rules) will also be awarded. Sidesaddle is judged separately. The judge will be on the course. *This class is not included in the division championships or special awards.*

The Coach Dog Class - House Class Rules

The Nashoba Carriage Classic pays tribute to the tradition of working dogs and carriages. The inaugural coaching dog class is to be worked individually on a numbered cones course.

A handler is required to bring the dog to the ring on leash.

Eligible Dogs: Any breed of dog may enter. If a dog does not have an AKC CD Obedience title, DCA CC title, or other organization equivalent title (or higher level), the judge may test the dog's obedience with the handler before the start of the coaching pattern (such as: completing a sit-stay, down-stay, recall, or heeling). If at any point the judge does not believe the dog is fully under control, the team may be dismissed. Under no circumstances at any point should a dog be tied to the carriage or be leashed/tied to a groom or driver of the carriage.

Scoring: The handler may choose the dog's coaching position (beside the hock or behind the carriage), but once in position must stay in position. The dog should stay in position without commands and with little interaction from the handler or driver. Light encouragement is allowed, but continuous luring of the dog into position should be severely penalized. The course is not timed, but the dog should work brightly without foraging or struggling to keep pace with the carriage. The dog should never move in front of the nose of the horse or lag behind more than one horse-length in distance from the carriage

Equipment: Dog must wear a flat collar with a snap or buckle. Small adornments (such as tags, bells, bows) on the collar are allowed if they do not impede the movement of the dog or risk being caught in the carriage. E-collars, prong collars, choke collars, and flexi-leads are not allowed in the competition ring. Harnesses are allowed provided they fit snugly and do not impede movement.

Dogs must be on a leash when not competing in the ring. Any dog that presents a hazard to persons, horses, or other dogs shall be disqualified and asked to leave the grounds immediately.

Dogs will complete the course one at a time. Extra time will be given for handlers/drivers to exchange dogs. Dogs waiting their turn to compete must wait leashed or crated ringside. Dogs that break loose and interfere with another dog's run will be excused.

Handler: The handler will walk the dog into the ring on a leash, and after the judge's command to unleash the dog, the handler may either ride on the carriage with the driver, or wait at the gate in the ring. The handler will take control of the dog at the end of the course. The handler does not need to be the owner of the dog. The handler is not allowed to bring any bait (such as toys or treats) into the ring. Handlers should dress conservatively or in groom's attire. Apron and gloves are not required for those riding on the carriage with the driver.

The Coach Dog Class, Cont'd.

Driver: The driver of the carriage does not have to be the owner of the dog. The driver may interact with the dog if necessary, especially in the event that the handler is not riding on the carriage, but they cannot have any bait in the ring. The driver should dress conservatively in the style of the vehicle and comply with ADS Turnout rules, including an apron, gloves, and hat or helmet.

Horse and Carriage: The horse may complete the cones course at the walk or the trot. The course is not timed. Each entry is based on the dog, not the horse, so the same horse and driver may work multiple times with a new dog. All horse tack must comply with ADS rules for Pleasure Driving Timed Obstacles. The carriage may be a pleasure or marathon-type vehicle. Wire wheels and pneumatic tires are permitted. Class is split into two categories: Traditional Coaching Breeds and Non-Traditional Breeds.

Coaching Breeds. Traditional coach dog breeds are as follows: Dalmatian, Collie, Great Dane, or predominant mix thereof; enter class 43.1. Non-traditional breeds are any breed or mix not specified in traditional breeds; enter class 43.2. All dogs are judged to the same standard of scoring.

Release Waivers must be signed for all drivers, passengers, grooms, and volunteers.

Pleasure Show - Side Saddle

The Sidesaddle Division highlights the tradition and versatility of the seat. Turnouts may be English (Walk, Trot, Canter), Western (Walk, Jog, Lope), Gaited (Walk, Intermediate Gait, Forward Gait), or Period. Appointments should be appropriate to that seat with an overall appearance of good taste and balance. *Not ADS affiliated or recognized*.

Divisions: Walk-Trot/Intermediate gait (marked with *) and Walk-Trot/Intermediate gait-Canter/ Forward gait (marked with +). A horse or pony may enter any of the sidesaddle classes. In order to be eligible for a division, the horse or pony must enter ALL three of the designated classes.

>To be eligible for the Walk-Trot Division Championship, entries must be entered in classes 44.1, 45.1, and 49, and cannot enter class 50 (18" Hunter Hack).

>To be eligible for the Walk-Trot-Canter Division Championship, entries must be entered in classes: 46.2, 47.2 and 50

>A Walk-Trot Division rider may also enter Class 46.1 and Class 47.1, but they do not count towards championship. A Walk-Trot Division rider may not enter Class 50.

>A Walk-Trot-Canter Division rider may enter Class 44.2, Class 45.2 and Class 49, but they do not count towards championship..

Class Numbers: The following classes are to be run concurrently and pinned separately:

44.1 and 44.2 Open Equitation Walk/Trot *

45.1 and 45.2 Open Pleasure Walk/Trot *

46.1 and 46.2 Open Equitation Walk/Trot/Canter +

47.1 and 47.2 Open Pleasure Walk/Trot/Canter +

A rider may not cross enter between divisions in classes that are run concurrently.

* and + indicate classes you must enter to be eligible for division championships.

Open Pleasure: Manners and suitability as a Pleasure mount are paramount. Transitions from one gait to another should be smooth and effortless. Horses must be obedient with prompt transitions. Entries should not exhibit extreme motion, speed, or resistance of any type. Horses must stand quietly and back readily in the line-up. Judge may ask for a walk, seated trot, or canter (or corresponding gait for Western, Gaited, or Period entries).

Pleasure Show - Side Saddle, Cont'd.

Open Equitation: The rider adopts a correct position showing suppleness and straightness and in balance with the horse/pony. The rider has a secure seat independent of reins, and applies correct aids unobtrusively and effectively, avoiding unnecessary movement. The horse should move freely forward in a consistent rhythm, be calm, relaxed and obedient to the aids and remain still when halted. Judge may ask for a walk, seated trot, or canter (or corresponding gait for Western, Gaited, or Period entries). The judge may ask the riders questions or select at least one-fourth of the class to work-off at the appropriate gaits (no dismounting).

Command Class: To be judged 100% on the ability of the rider to complete the judge's requests. The judge will call out a series of commands to the participants, with gaits not exceeding a trot. They may include figure 8, turn on the forehand, turn on the haunches, sidepass, rein back. Participants should be able to start the command within six steps. The judge may call any other command out to "eliminate" the participants or to judge their places in the class. Volunteers will act as "spotters" to help the judge.

Hunter Hack 18": To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Judges may ask for a hand gallop but no more than eight horses to hand gallop at one time. To jump two fences at 18". To be judged on performance and soundness with an emphasis on manners. Under Saddle performance to count 50%, Over Fences performance to count 50%. Certified safety helmets properly secured are required while riding in this class.
